UATH Begins Construction of Additional 32-Bedded A & E Unit


Management of the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital has commenced the expansion of the present Accident and Emergency Unit of the hospital as part of measures to enhance service delivery.

Handing over the project site to the contracting firm, the Chief Medical Director, Professor Bissallah Ekele said the design is for thirty-two beds of sixteen beds each for male and female.

The Chief Medical Director told the contracting firm, Unitrust Nigeria Limited, that management would pay details to quality of work.

He said the project which has a nine-month completion period would ease the congestion in the present Accident and Emergency Unit.

Professor Ekele who was represented by the Deputy Chairman, Medical Advisory Committee, Clinical, Dr. Terkaa

Atim said the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital was a high traffic facility with the Accident and Emergency Unit as one of the key service windows.

Responding, the Chief Executive

Officer, Unitrust Nigeria Limited, Builder Paul Ibinaye thanked the Management for the opportunity and gave an assurance that his firm would not only deliver on time, it would also deliver quality work. ■


hospital.

workplace in order to make the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital a true centre of medical excellence.

The Board Chairman gave an assurance that the Board will make policies in this regard and pleaded that staff accord the Management the needed cooperation for smooth implementation.

“As a Board, our relationship with you as critical stakeholders will be open and cordial from the beginning,” Dr. Jaja said.

The Chairman said while disagreements may not be inevitable, the Board would

appreciate a *modus operandi* based on rational thinking.

ensuring that areas of health care not currently covered by the hospital get coverage within the shortest possible time.

In a similar response on behalf of the Unions and Associations, President of the Association of Resident Doctors, Dr. Godday Akor thanked the Board for considering the Unions and Associations as critical stakeholders in the actualization of the mission and vision statements of the hospital and pledged the commitment of all workers to higher productivity and industrial peace. ■

Management Takes Over House Officers' Quarters from Contractor

Eight flats of three bedrooms each and four self-contained rooms making a total of twenty-eight rooms have been completed by the Management of the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital and now ready for use.

The project was conceived by the Management of the Hospital in 2013 and Johato Nigeria Limited was contracted with the construction under the supervision of the Federal Ministry of Works and Housing.

Taking over the completed edifice, the Chief Medical Director, Prof. Bissallah Ekele, said the project represents a giant step in tackling the very critical challenge of accommodation for House Officers in the hospital.

Prof. Ekele who was represented by the Chairman, Medical Advisory Committee, Dr. Nicholas Baamong, expressed satisfaction with the

UATH and Pro-Health International Sign Pact

The Management of University of Abuja Teaching Hospital and Pro-Health International had signed a Memorandum of Understanding, MOU, to work together in bringing health care to

the door-step of indigent and underserved people in rural communities across the country.

The partnership, which is part of the Corporate Social Responsibility of the University of Abuja Teaching

Hospital, would among others provide volunteer medical personnel of the hospital to support the medical mission of Pro-Health International, a faith based, non-profit and non-governmental organization.

Before signing the MOU, the Chief Medical Director, University of Abuja Teaching Hospital, Professor Bissallah Ekele, said the relationship would provide an excellent platform for rural communities to access healthcare at little or no cost.

He said the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital was excited about the partnership with Pro-Health International because government alone cannot provide the needs of all citizens.

The Chief Medical Director said the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital has the needed manpower to undertake the partnership with Pro-Health International.

Glaucoma: Over 250 Undergo Free Screening

Not fewer than two hundred and fifty residents of the Federal Capital Territory took

advantage of the window of opportunity offered by the 2018 World Glaucoma Week to have their

eyes tested free at the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital.

The Glaucoma Week, tagged: “Go, Get Your Eyes Tested for Glaucoma: Save Your Sight” ran from March 11-18, 2018.

Giving the breakdown, Head of the Local Organizing Committee, Dr. Uko Ekaette told UATH Bulletin that of the figure, one hundred and sixty-four were women. He also disclosed that six of the two hundred and fifty screened were diagnosed with glaucoma and that treatment had commenced for the six.

Dr. Ekaette said glaucoma also referred to as the ‘thief of sight’ is a leading cause of irreversible loss of vision in most nations of the world.

He said early presentation to the clinic and treatment was key to tackling the burden of glaucoma induced blindness in the developing world. ■


